Use strong language; climate and ecological, emergency, crisis not 'climate change'

A new logo for the ENTIRE transition/climate movement, so we are connected, prominent, normalized. Something like a patchwork of current logos arranged into a symbol. Stickers, patches, put on event advertising banners, a multi-logo 'quilt' etc

Speak the truth, declare and emergency and develop a visible movement or symbol

Declare a climate and ecological emergency at all levels Recognise our system is broken (eg growth, first nations genocide)

Act as though the truth is real:

Act at all levels (individual & society wide) with an emphasis on solutions (technological and political) in an interconnected way including diverse communities especially first nation peoples.





How we do and how we can engage with community.

Engage people at a grass roots level to create change

Promote Transition Streets in existing transition towns etc. and new areas too. Spread the word of transition streets to promote grassroots interest. 'from little things bit things grow'

DIY Micro Community Garden. Two or more neighbours pooling common space to grow food ie. verge on front yard

Pot luck dinners in the neighbourhood hosting repeating dinner

Ongoing monthly Food Fun Raising Event in local street neighbourhood communicated by word of mouth

Create a 'Rent a Grandparents opportunity' for those who haven't parents/grandparents to help care for children. Encourage and have conversations to bring more people in. Deal with the idea of 'other' to increase engagement with those who we would think of as others. Who is not with us now and how to get them in.

Events to hear the needs of the community and connect on a common goal



Learning, training and practicing.



Develop and practice skill to encourage and celebrate the silence so that we can hear quiet voices, particularly elders and 'authentic souls' rather than experts. Promoting the idea to look forward 7 generations in our decision making.

Local Food -Enhancing 'Backyard Sharing'

- 1. Share the "how to get started/what is it through Transition Australia
- 2. More specifically, for improvements
 - a. Explore ways of making it more attractive to landowners
 - b. Expand the concept to landowners and gardeners sharing the gardening

Helping the public understand why the future will include deep economic contraction

Empowering 'us' on pscho/social/spiritual level. This could include:

- Healing trauma
- 'We' practices a way of being together
- Nature/deep ecology/first nations leadership eg women's talking circle



Spaces to learn, grow and heal

Intentional Eco-Community. Nature healing focus (for residents and others), learning to live together (including non-violent conflict resolution skills). Starting with ample land and a 'Wurruk'an' type of community housing food growing etc.

Various stakeholders (communities, hospital, uni, property developers, employers etc)... build a showcase suburb/town/small city holistically. Include green space, walking streets, food forests, edible garden, multi-generational residence, affordable housing, preventive medicine hospital, well being collective etc. Then using this replicable scalable model build more and take elements to retrofit suburbs

Nature Healing Centre(s). - Save the Planet- Savour the Planet When people become reconnected with earth (ie a oneness with earth)

- Trauma work where need
- Embrace, Grief, Paradox, Uncertainty





How we work together



- Find out what is existing rather than start something new (eg re-invigorating learning exchange)
- Making connections between people and resources eg land and people who want to work on it (land and labour)
- Look at working examples: methods, changing systems, local
- Interest project base people connect around interests
- Localised action

Making Transition Towns activities child friendly with activities for children to do, food and at times that are appropriate for children Infiltrate the sporting clubs

To create greater inclusivity in Transition Groups

- Reflect on, become aware of barriers and attitudes around culture/gender/socio-economic etc
- Consult with existing communities eg lower SES to create connection

Funded alternative economic (ie heterodox) think tank - either freestanding (like commonwealth thinktank (or supporting the Australian Institute - expanded role with extra funding

Love Forest - Love Life

Lobbying governments to acknowledge the link between climate change and the loss of local biodiversity. Provide direction and certainty for impacted workers (Cath)

Using direct action to get the government to transition to a steady state economy whilst also steering away from neoliberal focused climate mitigation solutions - an education program to help mitigate political scaremongering and political violence

Local projects and protests for change

An organisation which supports vulnerable people by integrating into spare rooms/housing in the community with support of whole neighbourhood

- 4. Five year plan by supermarkets role of governments

Deep Gratitude Pause before meal breaks to acknowledge inter-connectedness with all life on earth. Like an acknowledgement of country bring about gratitude practice and acknowledge our intake (food supply, consumption) to highlight deep and ongoing connection with the earth.
