👤👏🗣️ Eucalypts of Boorloo Perth with Malcolm French 🗣️👏👤

On Thursday, 18 June about 30 people turned up to Royal Park Hall to hear Malcolm French talk about the Eucalypts of Boorloo Perth. In an interactive presentation which wowed the audience and got them thinking. For example, Malcolm asked the audience how many Eucalypts are native to the Perth region? The answer is 12! (No one got the answer. The highest guess was 6). Many of these species grew prolifically (along with banksia's and hakea's and close to the water, melaleuca) across the the City of Vincent prior to settlement. We have planted three species - Marri's, Jarrah and Tuart - in our Black Cockatoo pocket forest at Britannia and they are growing gangbusters! Malcolm's book, [Eucalypts of Western Australia — The South-west Coast and Ranges](#), co-authored with Dean Nicolle can be obtained from the City of Vincent library who also organised this event. 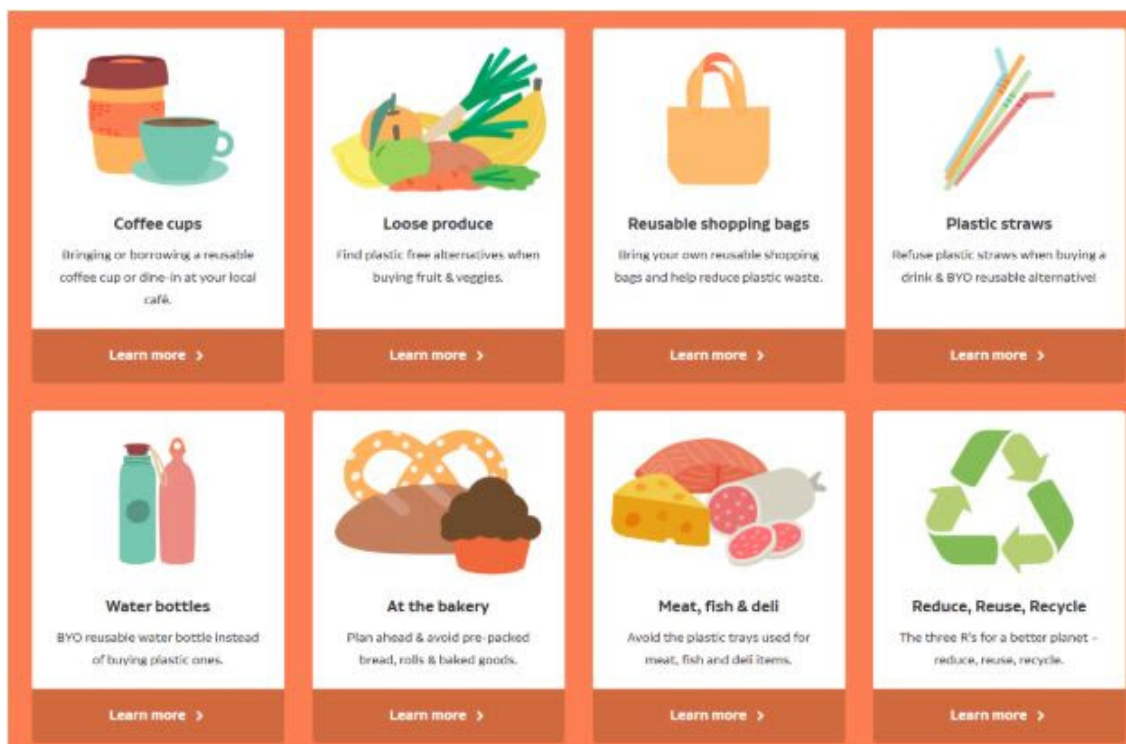


👍💡 Bette's 12 Tips to Inspire 💡👍

In June, Crawley Rotary hosted an event with Steve McCabe from Perth NRM talking about Banksia Woodlands which was both extremely educational and

entertaining. At our Black Cockatoo pocket forest we have planted 4 species of banksia which are native to the sands of Boorloo Perth and are growing really well. Local City of Vincent and Warndoolier resident Bette Parker (above) also spoke, having been touched by the plight of Black Cockatoos when one landed on her head at a similar event a while back. Since then Bette has been on a mission to do her bit to help the Black Cockatoo's. She provided 12 tips she follows to inspire others. Which one are you doing?

1. Protect existing canopy-agitate
2. Inspire future generations - black cockatoo kites
3. Plant native food - TTV
4. Protect
5. Build a cockitrough
6. Send an email to politicians
7. Buy art to remember
8. Find out more about Kaarakin
9. Put up signs
10. Go on parades - march
11. Apply for a *Let's Grow* grant for your school or community group
12. Spread the word about or screen the WA film *Black Cockatoo Crisis*

It's a new financial year. A perfect time to evaluate your finances. Is your money where your mouth is? This year, I made a commitment to myself to support the kinds of institutions that have transparent and ethical values that align with mine. I am not a financial expert, but with a little research, and a short-term inconvenience to move my funds... I've felt really good about it every day since. Here's some banks you might like to consider to match your values too. The first 3 are widely considered the most ethical and sustainable banks in Australia, being customer-owned, holding official B-Corp certification, and strictly avoiding investing in fossil fuels, old-growth logging, or destructive industries.

- **Bank Australia** is known for its "Clean Money" promise. This customer-owned bank operates on 100% renewable electricity, aims for net-zero by 2035, and maintains its own conservation reserve.
- **Beyond Bank** is the first Australian bank to receive B-Corp status. It places heavy emphasis on community investment and responsible lending to individuals and non-profits.
- **Teachers Mutual** Bank is consistently recognised as one of the world's most ethical companies. This bank directs significant investments into community and educational programs.
- **Rabobank** is not entirely "fossil-fuel free" but is highly rated for global sustainability. In Australia, it focuses heavily on promoting agriculture and sustainable farming.

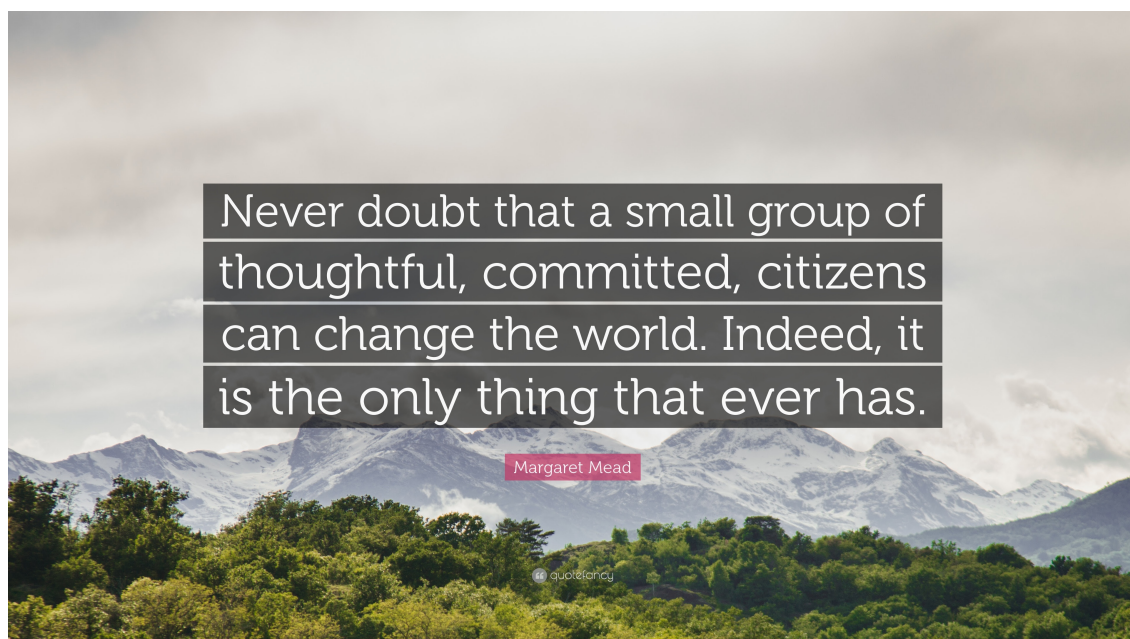
